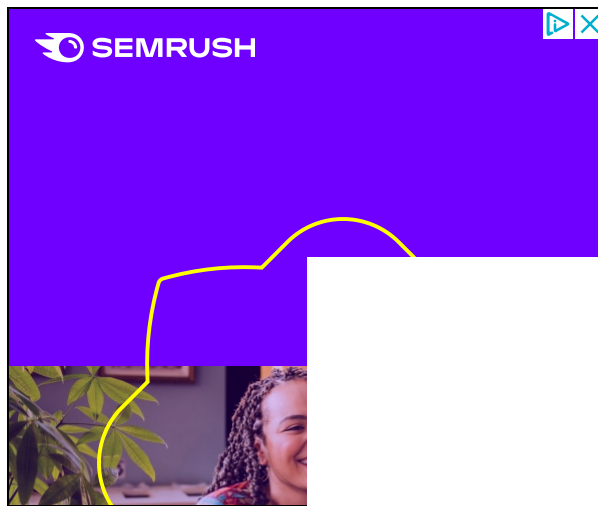

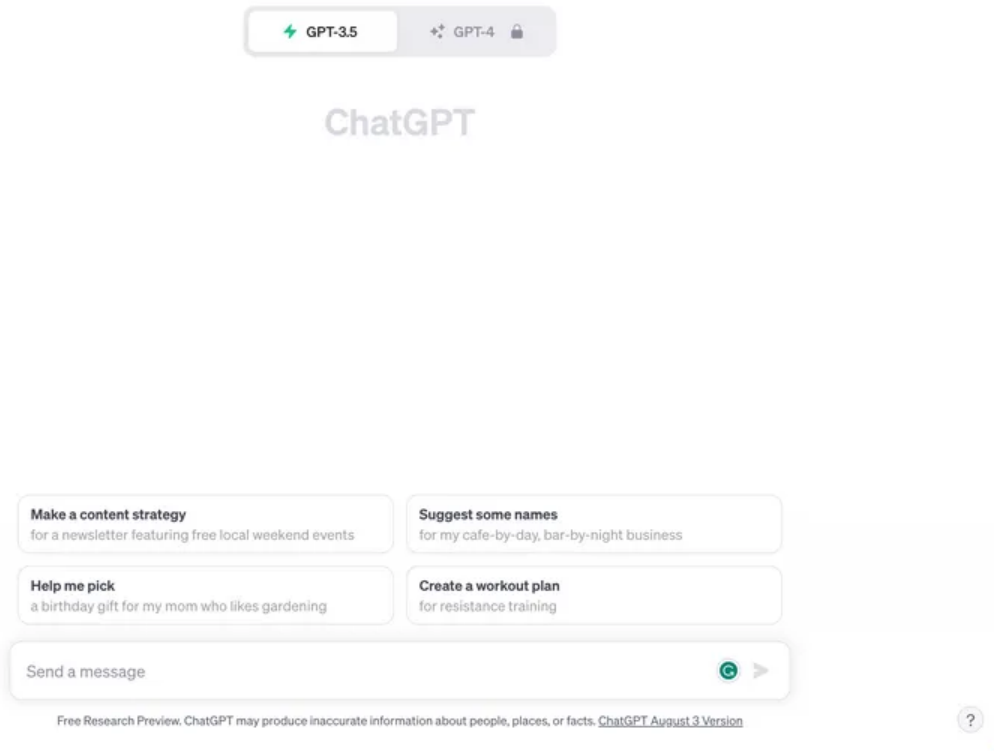

ChatGPT - Answers at your fingertips

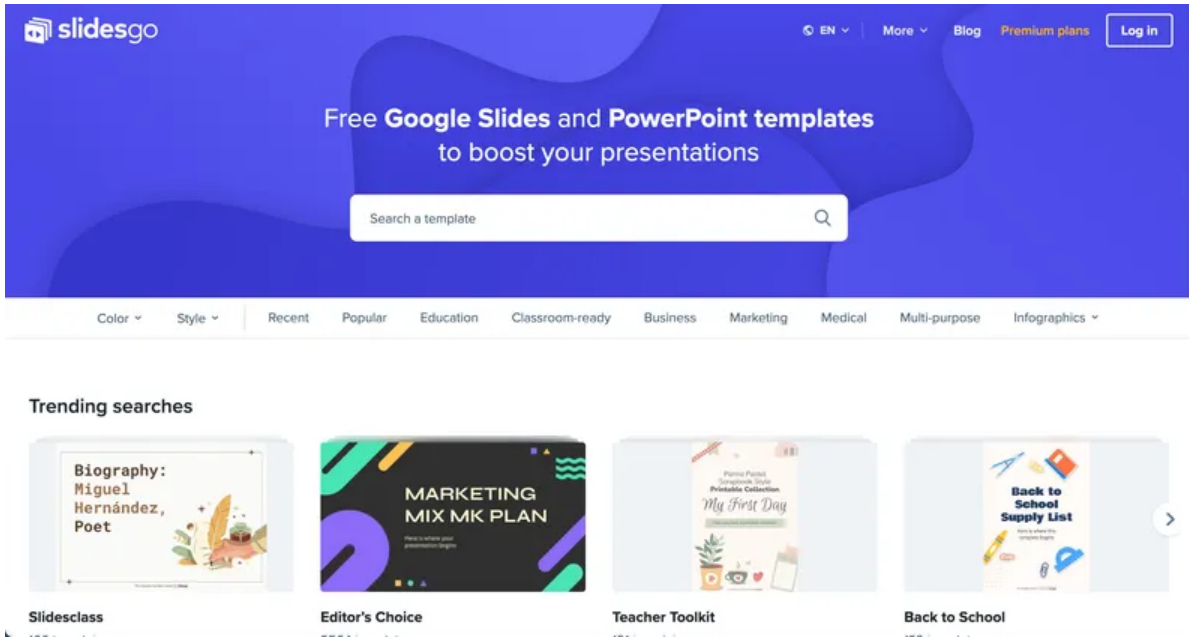


When it comes to AI tools, there is no bigger name than ChatGPT. The chatbot made by OpenAI does a bit of everything.

Sanebox - Getting a grip on your email



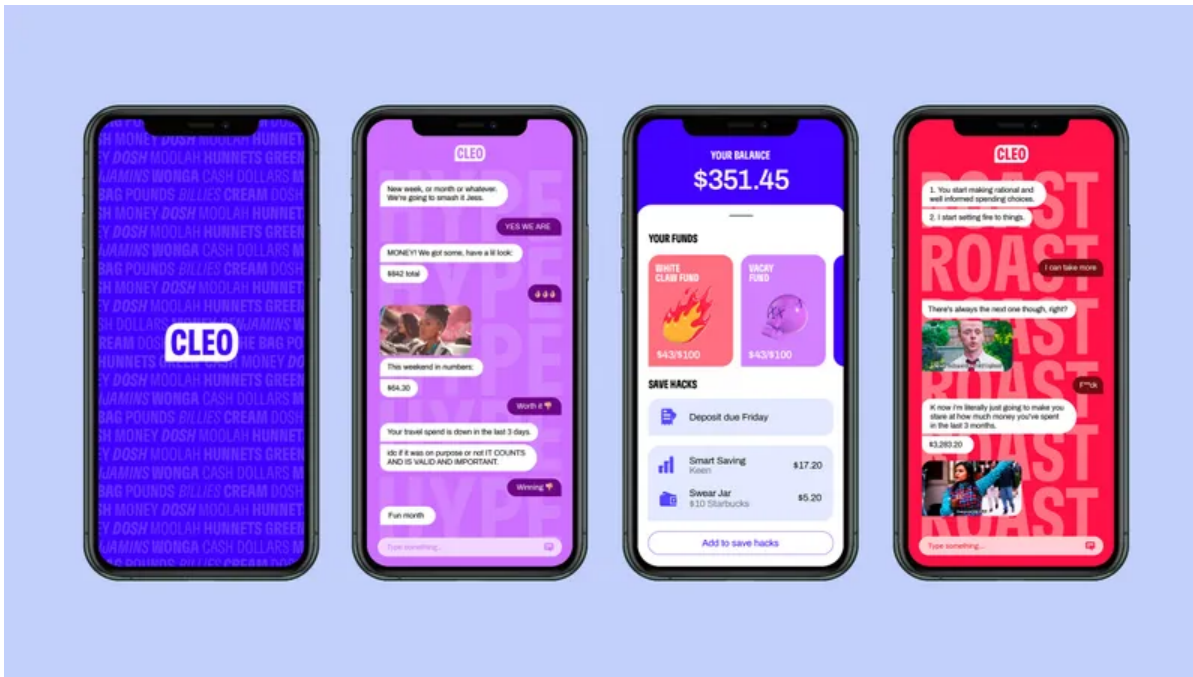
Getting through daily emails is a surprisingly mammoth task.

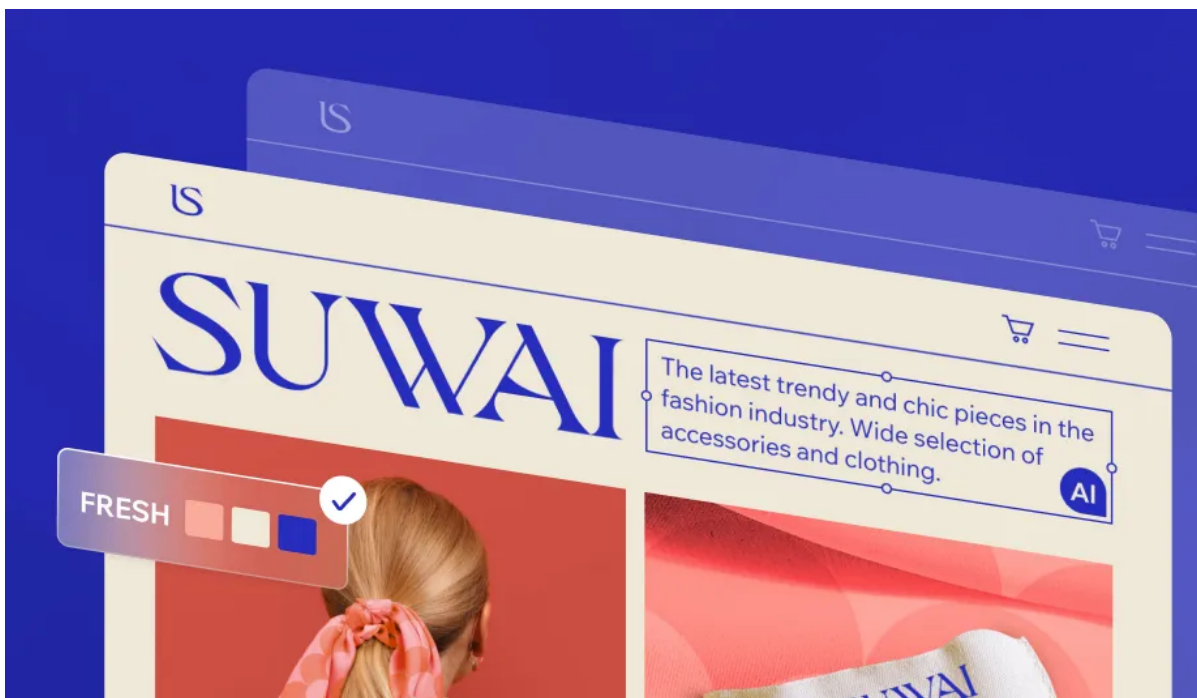

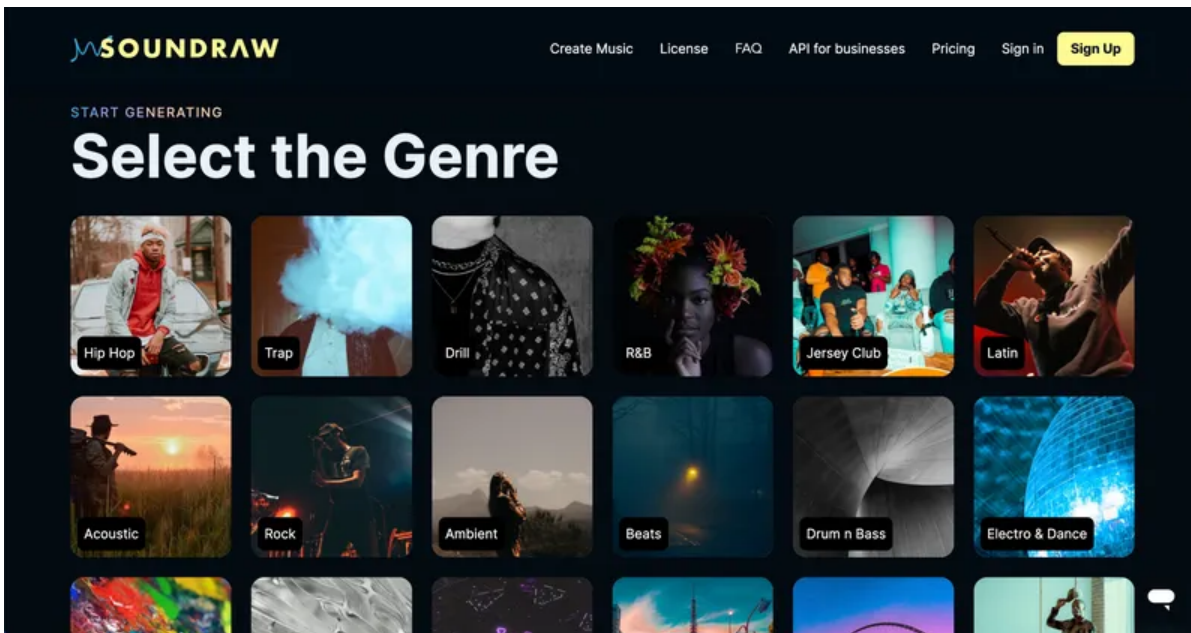
Wix ADI - Building a website

Genei - Supercharge your research

A litter of browser tabs, lists of researchers' papers to remember, and a highlighting system that you're sure made sense when you started.

Genei is a tool that attempts to tidy up a lot of these problems. It can summarise background reading and offer overviews and highlights from long papers.

These documents can then be stored in projects and folders, all of which can be searched for specific quotes and phrases. You can even ask Genei specific questions about a paper if it is only a niche idea you

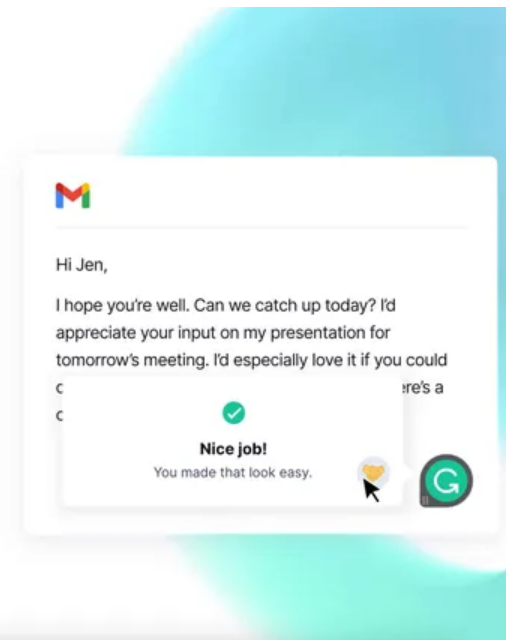
